CIRCLE TIME

Every day, indoors, the children will take part in several circle time sessions.

Our focus during these sessions are:

Speaking and Listening

Good listening is:

- *Looking at the person who is talking
- *Listening to ALL the words
- *Staying quiet
- *Sitting still



Mathematics

- *Use number names in counting rhymes, songs and stories.
- * Develop basic counting skills.
- * Sorting objects in our environment by colour, shape and size.

Communication and Language

- *Listening to and retelling stories
- *A weekly nursery rhyme
- *Phonics

Write Dance and Dough Dance

- *Develop gross and fine motor control through music, movement and mark making sessions

COMMUNICATION

What a strange time it is for you to begin school life - gone are those opportunities to come in, play and settle your little one into Nursery life. We miss that opportunity as much as you to chat at drop-off and pickup times.

It is key for Nursery age children that the parent communication continues as best as it can and so our initial aim is to provide:

- half-termly newsletters
- weekly website and parentapp updates of what we have been learning about every week
- additional parentapp updates for you to use at home as a talking point with your little one
- email communication

COLLECTION TIMES

Drop off and collections will always happen in the front playground. Once the children all begin full time (week beginning 14th September), our collection times are as follows:

- 11.30am (no lunch),
- 12.00pm (with lunch),
- 1.40pm (for those collecting siblings too)
- 3.10pm (Nursery/Red class children without sibling/s)
- 3.15pm (Nursery/Red class children with sibling/s).

We will all get into a routine of the different collection times on different days but please do let us know at drop off if there is any change from "the usual".

Breakfast and After School club is also available from 7.15-8.30am and 3.00pm-6.00pm respectively. Please speak to the school office if you are interested in these.

SNACK and DRINKS

We provide a snack every morning and afternoon with a choice of 4-6 healthy snacks across the day. The cost of these snacks is 20p per session and will be added to the termly invoice alongside lunches and extra sessions not covered by your free hours. These invoices will be coming to you after the whole term has finished. We also have water or milk in the morning and water at lunchtime and in the afternoon. There is no need for any snacks or drinks to be sent in, just an empty water bottle for the thirsty children amongst you. ☺
