It was celebrated this year on 27<sup>th</sup> October. <p>Research any festival which takes place around the world and <u>create a poster with pictures/information to show what happens during it.</u> Examples include- <u>Christmas, Diwali, Thanksgiving, Holi</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Research using books/internet</li> <li>Selecting key information</li> <li>Communicating findings</li> </ul>	<p>Ask Mrs James for a PE activity card. Photo/film yourself doing your chosen activity to share with the class.</p> <p>Focus: (Depending on the card)</p> <p>Balance Co-ordination Control Using equipment</p>	<p>Use some question words such as how, what and why to write 5 questions you would like to find out about India.</p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Formulating questions</li> <li>Writing in sentences using a CL and ?</li> </ul>	<p>Use a recipe book to cook a meal for your family to enjoy. If you can, find a recipe from another country such as a pizza from Italy or curry from India .</p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Reading and following a recipe</li> <li>Cooking skills such as cutting, weighing, measuring and timing.</li> </ul>
<p>Imagine you have visited India and write a postcard detailing things you may have seen there. <p><u>Read a version of the 'The Christmas Story' and create your own book with pictures/sentences.</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sequencing a story</li> <li>Writing using capital letters, finger spaces, verbs and full stops.</li> </ul>	<p>Record yourself singing your favourite Christmas song and email it to the office/ send in on a memory stick to share with the class.</p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Clear diction</li> <li>Expression</li> </ul>	<p><u>Research and make the flag of India in the most creative way e.g. Hama beads, collage, printing, icing on biscuits.</u></p> <p>Focus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Research</li> <li>Showing findings</li> <li>Creative</li> </ul>	<p>Ask Mrs James for an English or Maths worksheet.</p>

To help you organise your homework, it is a good idea to do a little every day. You can spend as long as you wish, but around 30 minutes per week should be enough for most activities.
