Parent Governor Election Autumn 2019

Thank you for your replies to our invitation for nominations for the vacancy of Parent Governor. There have been three nominations, as follows:

Claire Kirby-Webb- I have 4 years of experience as a Community Governor at Blackwell (2006-2010). During my term, I used my employer's community programme & other business relationships to support the school. This included bringing business teams in to work on projects, securing £10K grant funding and leading a Young Enterprise Programme. I now have two daughters at Blackwell and am again active in supporting the school. I recently used my experience coaching School Business Managers to identify ParentsApp as a tool to develop parent communication. The app has also reduced administration & associated costs in the office. This year I was involved in organising 'The Blackwell Ball' which proved to be a great success and raised £8K for the PFTA fund. I have 20 years of corporate experience, largely focused around people and capability development. I previously used this on the HR committee and was responsible for the Head Teacher's performance review. Aside from my experience, I think the main point I would like to emphasise is my passion for the school. Blackwell provides a unique learning environment and I genuinely want to support its development and continue the excellent provision for children over the next 4 years.

Alison Taylor- My daughter is in Green Class and my son in Nursery. We live between Barnt Green and Blackwell, and chose to settle here due to our strong wish to be part of an active village community. I have initiated and supported a number of fundraising events for the PFTA, and have attended their meetings regularly. Due to my passion for education, I am now keen to become more involved with the school. I have been teaching for 18 years and have special interests in Early Years education and Special Educational Needs. I have worked in several settings, including mainstream state schools in Dudley and Birmingham, an all age special school in North Tyneside, and I currently work part time as SENCo at The Blue Coat Independent Preparatory school in Edgbaston.
