


# Homework for TELL ME A STORY- Green Class

In light of feedback from Parent Questionnaires, we will continue to underline tasks that are more easily completed by children independently, but will also include some worksheets at the request of some families.

<p>Write a book review. Choose one of your favourite stories from home or your school reading book and write a review about it.</p> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Write the title copying it carefully</li> <li>Tell the reader what the book is about in a simple sentence or two</li> <li>Say what you liked most and draw a picture of that part</li> <li>Use full stops and capital letters and remember finger spaces</li> </ul>	<p><u>Create a dance to tell a story.</u></p> <p>Choose one of your favourite stories or use a traditional tale. Create a sequence of moves to tell the story through a dance.</p> <p>Think about the main events of your story and how you can show these through movements.</p> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Clear movements</li> <li>High and low movements</li> </ul>	<p>Find out 5 facts about the countries in the United Kingdom. Look at a map or research in a book or on the internet.</p> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Read facts with a grown up.</li> <li>Talk about what you have found out.</li> <li>Decide what the best 5 facts would be.</li> <li>Write facts in your own words.</li> </ul> <p>(Include full stops and capital letters as well as those finger spaces)</p>	<p>Write and solve + and – word problems using a story theme.</p> <p>e.g. The Three Little Pigs had 22 bricks to build a house. They needed 30. How many more did they need?</p>
<p><u>Make a picture story map showing the sequence of events in a traditional tale.</u></p> <p>You could use;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Three Little Pigs</li> <li>Goldilocks and the Three Bears</li> <li>The Three Billy Goats Gruff</li> </ul> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Draw pictures to describe each event in the story</li> <li>Find a way to show which picture comes next in your story map (for example, numbers or arrows)</li> </ul> 	<p>Create your own story stick.</p> <p>Create a story stick when you go on a walk or an outdoor adventure! Once you have finished it you can tell a friend or grown up a story about the journey you have been on.</p> <p>This website will give you some ideas and provide some help.</p> <p><a href="https://growingfamily.co.uk/craft/journey-stick-kids-nature-crafts/">https://growingfamily.co.uk/craft/journey-stick-kids-nature-crafts/</a></p>	<p>Draw your own map of the United Kingdom by looking at a map online or in an atlas.</p> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Draw outline of the United Kingdom</li> <li>Label or colour the different countries</li> </ul> <p>Can you find the capital of England and put it onto your map?</p>	<p><u>Play 'George's Busy Day' on a computer.</u></p> <p>You can play on your own or with a partner. <p>Watch or read the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Write about one of the characters. Consider:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Are they a good or bad character?</li> <li>What do they do that makes the reader think that?</li> </ul> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Full stops and capital letters</li> <li>Finger spaces</li> </ul>	<p><u>Create a new story book cover for one of your favourite stories.</u></p> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Write the title of the story</li> <li>Use full stops, capital letters and finger spaces</li> <li>Think about the key parts of the story to add to the front cover</li> </ul>	<p>Would you like to live in Scotland? Why/why not? Explain your reasons.</p> <p><b>Focus:</b></p> <p>Start your argument with the sentence 'I would like to live in Scotland because...' or 'I wouldn't like to live in Scotland because...'.
