### **OUR VISION**

At **Blackwell First School** we aim to educate the whole child and to ensure children are happy, healthy and fulfill their potential in terms of development of skills for life, social and moral values and academic success.

In order to develop well rounded children, Blackwell offers:

- Stimulating and creative learning, with a focus on basic skills
- Education to support future careers
- Skill development centered around personal and social skills
- Opportunities to develop healthy lifestyles



## **OUR CURRICULUM**

#### Curriculum

Our Early Years and Primary curriculum offers stimulating and creative learning with a focus on the basic skills of speaking and listening, reading, writing and maths. In order to equip the children for their whole lives, Blackwell develops well rounded children for the future through the development of personal and social skills, healthy lifestyles and skills for life, including ICT.

We work as a school community on whole school topics, over a five year rolling programme, which focus strongly on the learning process. Each topic lasts for a few weeks and children work towards an outcome whilst developing learning and social skills during their project work. Topics are designed to develop a sense of community and citizenship and an appreciation of the world in which we live. Our Forest School work based on a Scandinavian outdoor learning philosophy supports this ethos. We regularly invite visitors to enhance curriculum work and also participate in relevant educational visits.

#### Foundation Stage curriculum

This is the curriculum for children prior to and including the reception year in school. The focus is on ensuring children develop in a safe environment that supports their well being, social skills and increased personal independence. Skills and knowledge are developed through relevant and enjoyable planned learning experiences. A strong emphasis is placed on practical 'hands on' activities and the use of the outdoor areas in school. The Foundation Stage has six areas of learning:

- Personal, Social and Emotional development
- Communication, Language and Literacy
- Mathematical development
- Knowledge and Understanding of the World
- Physical development
- Creative development

#### Primary curriculum

This is the curriculum for children from 5 to 11 years of age. The focus is on ensuring children make progress in the key areas of learning (basic skills) whilst developing skills across the whole curriculum. At Blackwell we foster a love of learning with an emphasis on developing skills for life (including collaboration, enquiry, communication, problem solving and independence) through our topic work. The Primary Curriculum subjects taught are:

- English
- Maths
- Information and Communication Technology
- Science
- History
- Geography
- Religious Education
- Physical Education
- Personal Social Health Education
- Music
- Art
- Design Technology
- Modern Foreign Languages (French)







## **OUR SCHOOL DAY**

- 8.45-55am Doors open-children arrive
- 8.55am Registration
- 9.05am Collective Worship
- 9.20am Morning lessons
- 12.00-12.55pm Lunch
- 1.00pm Afternoon lessons
- 3.15pm End of the school day

#### Arrival at school

Children may come into school from 8.45am and staff will be in their classrooms ready to welcome them. The school day officially begins at 8.55am. All children are expected to be in class by this time for registration. Latecomers must sign into the school office.

#### Collective Worship

Collective Worship takes place every morning, where we celebrate the new school day. Each week certificates are awarded to individuals for effort, achievement, attainment or for being a good, caring school citizen. We also celebrate birthdays during Collective Worship on Wednesdays.

#### Wake and Shake

Wake and Shake sessions are twice daily aerobic routines that the children take part in, in order to develop health and fitness and readiness for learning. A new routine is learned each half term and a school competition is held and the winning class is presented with a cup as 'Wake and Shake Champions'.

#### **Break Times**

Morning play times are taken when most appropriate for individual classes. A drink (milk or water) and healthy snack (from home or purchased from the school healthy tuck shop) are consumed during the morning. Afternoon breaks are Active Breaks and are taken when appropriate for individual classes. They consist of learning skipping skills, traditional playground games and aerobic activities designed to develop fit and healthy individuals. All children should have a named school water bottle in school in order for them to have access to drinking water during the day.

#### Lunch Times

At lunchtime, children may purchase hot meals (pre ordered) or bring healthy lunches from home. High priority is given to healthy eating and the development of good social skills. Children also enjoy an outside play over the lunchtime period.

#### End of the day

School finishes at 3.15pm. Children are dismissed by staff to their parents or a nominated collector. A child will only be allowed to go with someone other than their parent if the teacher has been **notified beforehand**, stating the name of the collector.

#### Clubs

The Montessori Before and After School Club is run in the Methodist Church Hall in Blackwell and details are available through the school office. A wide variety of clubs is offered on the school site and they vary on a termly basis.

#### Absence

All absences must be reported to the **school office** in order for them to be authorised. Children may be absent for holidays during term time, although this is discouraged. Authorised absence for holidays must be requested from the head teacher and is limited to 10 school days in an academic year.

#### Medication

If your child has medical needs please inform the office staff, head teacher and class teachers. A supply of appropriate medication such as inhalers should be kept in school. Routine medication is not administered by school staff. If a child needs prescription medication, it must be administered by a parent or after written consent, the office staff.

## **OUR UNIFORM**

The wearing of school uniform is an expression of belonging to our learning community and all children are expected to adopt the following dress code:

- · Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress
- Sky blue shirt or blouse
- Burgundy cardigan, pullover or sweatshirt (with school badge\*)
- Blue and white checked dress (in Summer)
- Grey shorts (in Summer)
- Black school shoes

#### For P.E. lessons the code is as follows:

- White polo shirt (with school badge\*)
- Navy or white shorts
- Black pumps for indoor lessons
- Trainers for outdoor lessons
- Burgundy sweatshirt/navy jogging bottoms

Pump bags, book bags and water bottles are also part of our essential school equipment. (These items may be ordered from the school office).

Small wristwatches and stud earrings are the only items of jewellery allowed, on health and safety grounds. These items should be removed for P.E. lessons.

N.B// All items of clothing must be **clearly named**, including vests, socks and shoes.





## **ADMISSION**

Blackwell First School strives to ensure that every child settles quickly into school. Parents are encouraged to bring their children to school regularly prior to entry.

The induction programme for prospective Reception children and parents

#### Before admission

- open morning and evening Autumn term
- weekly story club (Easter to July) which provides an extended opportunity to make new friends and meet the teachers
- · induction evening Summer term
- · induction day Summer term

#### After admission

- gradual entry during the first 2 weeks
- new parent's meeting during first few days of the Autumn term
- parent consultation meeting Autumn term

Admission for pupils with disabilities

We offer provision to support those children with disabilities. The Accessibility Legislation (2003) ensures that the school is open to all children.





## **OUR CLASSES**
