Can you find out what they are called and where they are? You can use the internet and books to help you. Can you find any interesting facts about these oceans?</p> <p>Focus;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Search for an ocean on a map • Name the continent where the ocean is or a country it is near. • Research an interesting fact. 	<p>Practise the 2, 5 and 10 x tables. If you could be anything in the rock pool, what would you be? Explain why. Give at least three reasons.</p>	<p>Use the internet to find out about a creature in the sea. Write a fact file about it. Find out:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where you might find them • What they look like • What they eat • Extra interesting facts. <p>Remember to stay safe when using the internet. You might need a grown up to help you.</p>
<p>Have a go at finding all the words on the <u>Rainbow Fish word search sheet</u> (attached). Remember – the words can go in any direction!</p>	<p><u>Make up a dance to 'The Carnival of the Animals - Aquarium'. You could record your dance so that we can watch it, or if you're brave enough, perform to us in the classroom if you are in school.</u></p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A range of movements that match the rhythm of the song. • A sequence that you can repeat. • Moments of stillness. • A starting and finishing shape. 		<p>In Science, we are looking at everyday materials. Choose 3 materials that you have at home (or in the garden). Draw them and describe what they are like.</p> <p>Focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Draw what the material looks like • Name the material • Write about how it feels and what it looks like
<p>Helpful websites (with parental supervision)</p> <p>Websites are listed on Home Learning packs or within tasks above, where appropriate.</p>
