# NEWSLETTER for Blackwell First School- Yellow Class



Welcome back! I hope that you all had a lovely half term break and enjoyed some exciting activities. This half term, our learning opportunities will continue to develop and we will have lots of new things happening, including being able to share our learning with other classes. Mrs Marks, Mrs Flynn and I will continue to support the children in building their confidence in their learning and their independent skills. Our new topic is Traditional Tales, so we have lots of reading and writing opportunities ahead of us.

# **TOPIC**

We start our half term with an inspiring topic — Traditional Tales! Through our focus of Sleeping Beauty, we will be improving our painting skills which will help us to create our woodland and castle artwork. We will be creating tints and tones and using techniques that Vincent Van Gogh and Sean Scully have used to create artwork.

The other area of the curriculum that we will be covering in this topic is Science. This will focus on humans and animals. Specifically, the children will be learning about why animals and humans need food. They will also be exploring the skeletal system and muscles in bodies.

PSHE, Music, Computing, French, P.E and Philosophy for Children are taught each week throughout the year. See our 'Curriculum' page on the school website for more information.

### **LITERACY**

As a class, we will read 'Sleeping Beauty'. This story will help the children to develop their vocabulary and comprehension skills.

The children will then have the chance to write their own story inspired by the traditional tale, using good word choices and using expanded sentences to capture the reader's attention. The children will have regular handwriting sessions to help to continually develop their cursive handwriting to assist them in becoming fluent writers.

In spelling, the children will be taught a range of spelling conventions including adding prefixes mis- and re- and the /i/ sound spelt y. Different learning strategies will also be introduced to give the children ideas of how to practise spellings in a variety of ways. We will also practise reading and spelling the following tricky words:

calendar, caught, centre, century, certain, circle, complete, consider, continue, decide, describe, different, disappear, early, earth, eight, eighth, enough, exercise, experience.

# NUMERACY

During Numeracy, children will continue to take part in a range of activities to help develop their understanding of 2 and 3-digit numbers. They will also continue to improve their ability to add and subtract 2-digit numbers mentally and 3- digit numbers using a written method. Problem solving will take place every day to apply new learning.

We will also carry out separate problem solving lessons regularly to develop the children's logical thinking.

Mental maths starters will continue to focus on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, number bonds to 100, doubles and halves to 20. We will also revisit the 2, 5 and 10 times table to ensure the children know them by heart and out of order.

Daily times table practice at home significantly helps too!

I am really enjoying teaching your children again and looking forward to the learning that is taking place this half term.
