WHAT WILL WE BE LEARNING?

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

*Find out how to keep healthy (diet, exercise, sleep).

*Focus on kind hands and actions toward ourselves, family and friends.

*Recap tricky letters and sounds from last half term e.g. oi (boil), ow (cow), ur (turn) and er (her).

*Read and spell CVCC words (tent) and CCVC words (stop).

*Share and retell 'The Enormous Turnip'.

*Begin to write sentences using capital letters, finger spaces, verbs and full stops.

- *Use subitising and knowledge of number facts to quickly add and subtract.
